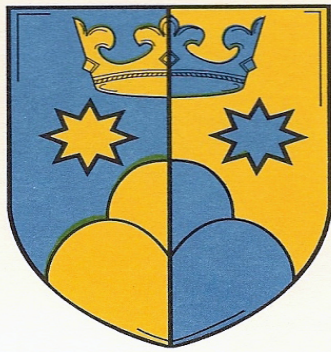

## SACRAMENTS

Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, their marriage must be recognized by the Catholic Church. These requirements are the universal law of the Church, and are not determined by the individual Parish. If the person you choose as godparent fulfills these requirements, they are asked to furnish a statement from their Parish that they are indeed eligible to be a Sponsor.

### Sacrament of Reconciliation

Confessions are heard every Saturday from 4:15 to 4:45 p.m. in the Church.

### Sacrament of Marriage

Diocesan policy requires that couples participate in a marriage preparation program prior to their wedding. To ensure that all the necessary arrangements can be made, couples should contact the Parish Office at least one year in advance of their wedding date, and before any other plans have been made.

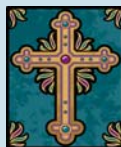

## A Perspective on Today's Readings

"We always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith, that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you and you in him, in accord with the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ." "Zacchaeus, come down quickly for today I must stay at your house." "Today salvation has come to this house."



Our friend Zacchaeus went the extra mile to get a glimpse of Jesus. On the Jericho road he climbed a tree because of the crowd. Jesus spotted him and asked to go to his home. He responded.

The dialogue which followed concerning his generosity and desire to repent and repay, earned the profound statement 'today salvation has come to this house.' Salvation, Jesus, the name's the same.

My journey, on the street in front of my church, at home, at work, offers me the opportunity to meet the same Jesus. I don't have to search Him out, He is here waiting to meet me, speak with me in prayer and offer me the same gift, His own life. For this reason St. Paul mentions our calling at this moment.

Consider for a moment how Mr. Zacchaeus must have felt being told by Jesus that his effort was fruitful. He knew where he stood before the Lord. No running ahead, no climbing, just sit back and let His grace and power direct and influence our lives. Where do I stand before the Lord?
