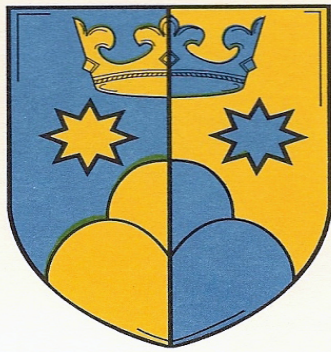

SACRAMENTS

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated the first and third Sunday of each month at 12:45 p.m. Parents are asked to call the Parish Office to schedule a date. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, must attend Mass regularly and, if married, their marriage must be recognized by the Catholic Church. These requirements are the universal law of the Church, and are not determined by the individual Parish. If the person you choose as godparent fulfills these requirements, they are asked to furnish a statement from their Parish that they are indeed eligible to be a Sponsor.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Confessions are heard every Saturday from 4:15 to 4:45 p.m. in the Church.

Sacrament of Marriage

Diocesan policy requires that couples participate in a marriage preparation program prior to their wedding. To ensure that all the necessary arrangements can be made, couples should contact the Parish Office at least one year in advance of their wedding date, and before any other plans have been made.

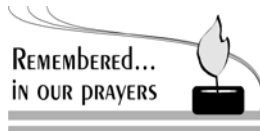

First Reading: Malachi 1:14b—2:2b, 8-10

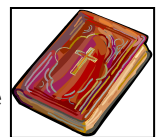
This passage from Malachi denounces the laxity and unfaithfulness of the people and especially of the priests, who failed in their duties to God and their neighbors.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13

Paul reminisces about his extremely happy and successful visit with the Thessalonians. He praises them once again for their immediate and open acceptance of his message as truly the word of God.

Gospel: Matthew 23:1-12

In a strongly worded message, Jesus again rebukes the Pharisees for the hypocritical ostentation and love of honor and position. He reminds the people and the disciples that the truly greatest one is the one who serves others. He ends with the words, "Whoever exalts himself shall be humbled, but whoever humbles himself shall be exalted."

CHANGES ARE COMING

In order to prepare us for the changes to the congregation's prayers and responses for the upcoming changes to the Roman Missal, a series of instructions will be provided. Since the explanations of the changes will take time, these presentations *will take place outside of Mass* and will be held in **Shepherds Hall after the 11:30 Mass on November 6, 2011.**

Additional presentations may be scheduled, on an as needed basis. Please plan to attend one of these sessions so that the changes implemented by the Church this coming Advent season are familiar to all of you.

Why is the Mass going to change next month?

Actually the Mass isn't going to change but some prayers we say will sound different when the Third Edition of the Roman missal is implemented on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27th. The Missal is the guide to the prayers and instruction of the Catholic Mass. The update will include newly canonized Saints as well as additional prayers and Masses. Although the Mass is the same, the new translation will make it a more meaningful and authentic interpretation of the original Latin.
